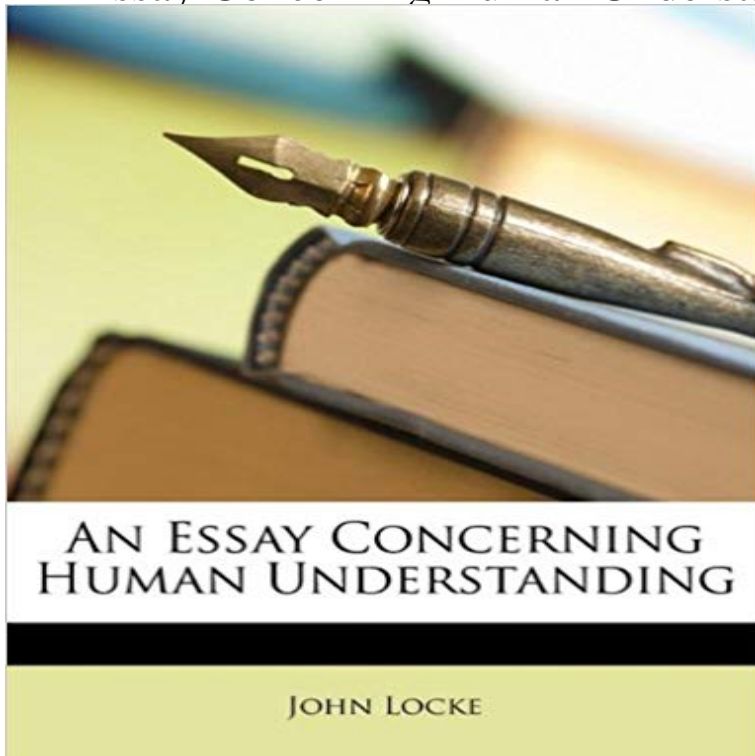


An Essay Concerning Human Understanding
