


Requiem for a Nun

Yet it remains an irritating example of the genre, since it appears to defy even the loosest definition of a novel. In an attempt to save her, Temple goes to see the judge to confess her own guilt. Told partly in prose, partly in play form, *Requiem for a Nun* is a work of fiction written by William Faulkner which was first published in 1951.
