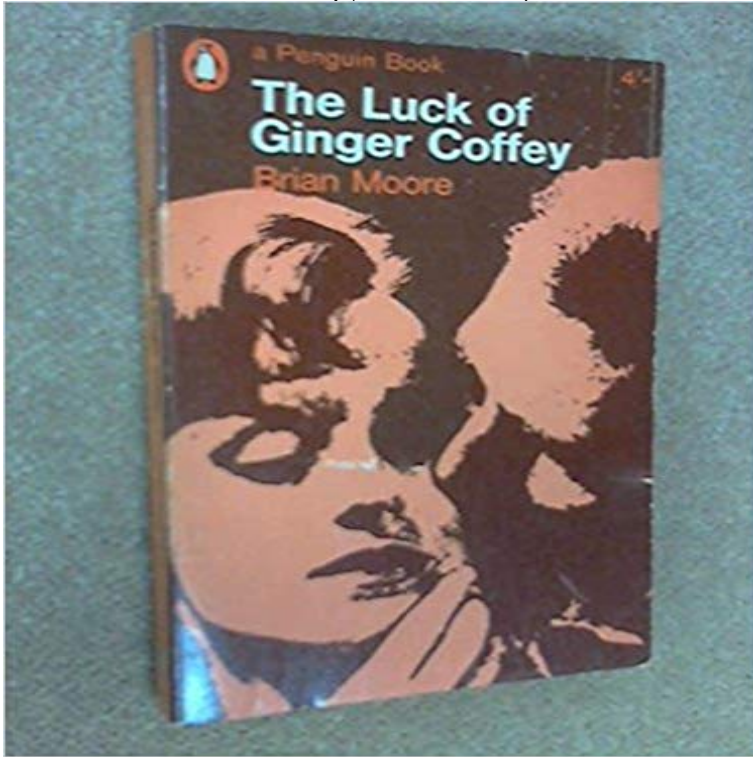


The Luck of Ginger Coffey
